For each chapter of the London Baptist Confession of Faith, there is a corresponding chapter and gives anoutline of it before explaining it. The author does not stop withjust explaining the chapter but also gives some history on many of the thoughts of the Confession and how it compares to the Westminster Confession of Faith. I was surprised by how easy thisbook was to read. Waldron does not have a scholarly way of writingthat makes for dry reading but an amiable style that keeps thereader moving through the book.
